### **Word Problems**

A baker made 5 trays of cookies with 8 cookies on each tray. How many cookies did the baker make?

There are 6 chairs in each row and 4 rows in a school hall. How many chairs are there?

Drawing space:

Answer: chairs
A farmer has 3 baskets with 9 apples each. How many apples are there in total?  Drawing space:
Answer: apples

### Answer Key

#### Skip Counting:

- Count by 3's: 3, 6, 9, 12, 15, 18, 21, 24
- Count by 4's: 4, 8, 12, 16, 20, 28, 32
- Count by 7's: 7, 14, 21, 28, 35, 42, 49

#### Repeated Addition:

- $7 + 7 + 7 + 7 = 28 \rightarrow 4 \times 7 = 28$
- $6+6+6+6+6+6=36 \rightarrow 6 \times 6=36$
- $8 + 8 + 8 + 8 + 8 + 8 = 40 \rightarrow 5 \times 8 = 40$

#### Arrays:

- Stars: 3 rows × 3 columns = 9
- Smiley faces: 2 rows × 4 columns = 8

#### **Tough Multiplication Facts:**

- $3 \times 4 = 12$
- $5 \times 6 = 30$
- $7 \times 8 = 56$
- $9 \times 3 = 27$

#### Word Problems:

- Baker: 5 trays × 8 cookies = 40 cookies
- Chairs: 6 chairs × 4 rows = 24 chairs
- Farmer: 3 baskets × 9 apples = 27 apples
