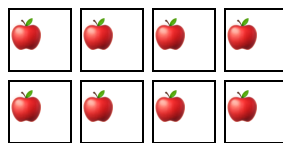

Count the apples in the array:



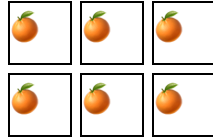
rows \times columns = apples

Advanced Word Problems

Solve these challenging real-world problems.

Advice: Read and draw a diagram to help solve the problem.

A toy store has 14 boxes of puzzles. Each box contains 6 puzzles. How many puzzles are there in total?

Drawing space:

Answer: puzzles

Lucy read 21 pages each day for 5 days. How many pages did she read overall?

Drawing space:

Answer: pages

A library has 7 shelves with 15 books each. How many books are there in total?

Drawing space:

Answer: books

A classroom has 5 tables with 4 chairs each. How many chairs are there?

Drawing space:

Answer: chairs

A gardener planted 8 rows of flowers with 3 flowers per row. How many flowers in total?

Drawing space:

Answer: flowers

Mark has 10 packs of pencils with 2 pencils each. How many pencils does he have?

Drawing space:

Answer: pencils



Answer Key

Multi-digit Multiplication:

- $12 \times 3 = 36$
- $15 \times 4 = 60$
- $23 \times 2 = 46$
- $14 \times 5 = 70$
- $16 \times 3 = 48$
- $18 \times 2 = 36$

Advanced Arrays:

- Apples: 2 rows \times 4 columns = 8
- Bananas: 3 rows \times 3 columns = 9
- Oranges: 2 rows \times 3 columns = 6

Advanced Word Problems:

- Toy store: 14 boxes \times 6 puzzles = 84 puzzles
- Lucy: 21 pages \times 5 days = 105 pages
- Library: 7 shelves \times 15 books = 105 books
- Classroom: 5 tables \times 4 chairs = 20 chairs
- Gardener: 8 rows \times 3 flowers = 24 flowers
- Mark: 10 packs \times 2 pencils = 20 pencils
